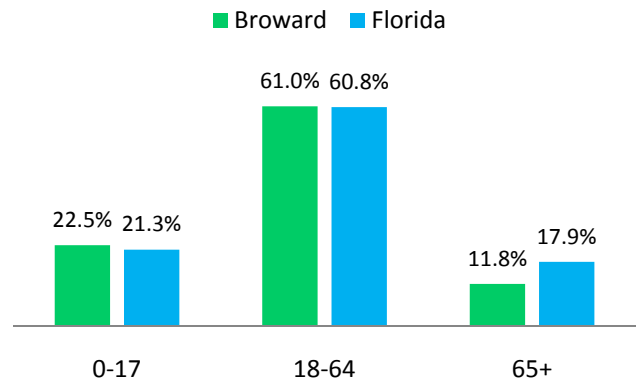

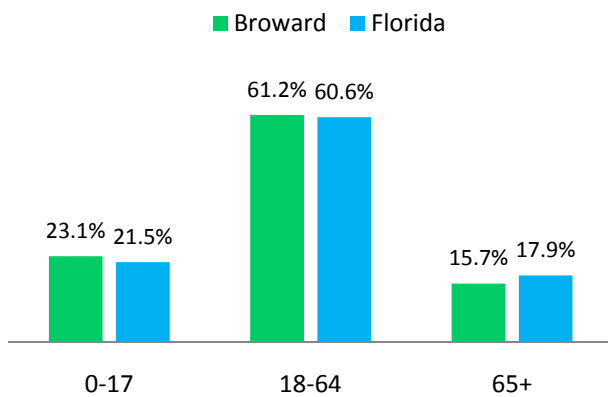

Age Distribution, 2008



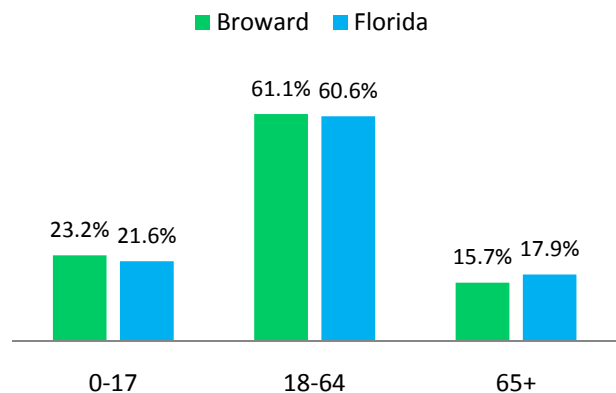

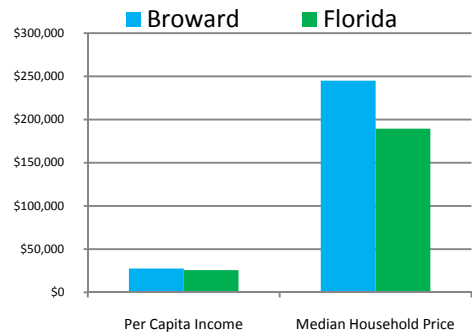

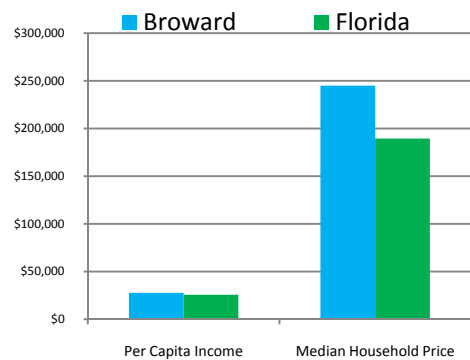

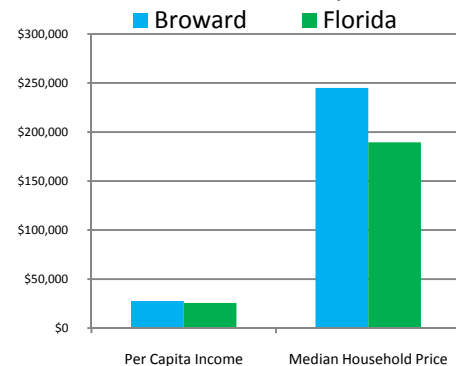
Income Indicators, 2007

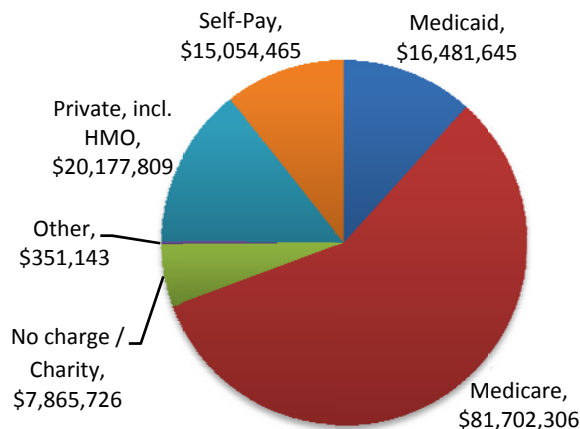
